Introduction

The Prayer of the Church has been the regular pattern of prayer for priests, religious and consecrated people to pray at different times of the day, each day of the year for hundreds of years. Many people from all walks of life also use this form of daily prayer.

For over a century it has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the days between the Ascension and Pentecost.

In recent years many Christian denominations throughout the world have also been praying for this intention through a prayer initiative called 'Thy Kingdom Come'. By joining this initiative, we are therefore renewing our desire for the Kingdom of God to be made real in the lives of those we know and love through the power of the Holy Spirit.

This booklet has been produced for those who would like to use the Night Prayer of the Church between the Ascension and Pentecost as we pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit during this time.

By doing so we follow the example of the disciples who prayed continuously between the Ascension and Pentecost. Very few people have the time to pray continuously on their own, but at each moment someone, somewhere in the world will be praying the

Prayer of the Church. In other words, when praying Night Prayer we take part in the continuous prayer of the Church.

Throughout this journey from the Ascension to Pentecost we can pray for those we know and love to receive a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit, so that they might encounter the person of Jesus Christ and know how much God our Father loves them.

The basic structure of Night Prayer is as follows:

- Opening Refrain
- Hymn (choose one from the end of this booklet)
- Psalm(s)
- Scripture Reading
- Short Responsory
- Nunc Dimittis
- Concluding Prayer
- Anthem to the Blessed Virgin Mary (you can choose one from the end pages).


Whether praying on your own or as part of a group it would be better to take time to reflect on one part or leave space between the different elements of Night Prayer than to rush through it.

If you choose to pray in a group, it would be a good idea to appoint someone to lead the prayer. They should read the parts marked as 'leader' and begin the antiphons.

In addition to the normal format of Night Prayer, there is also an intention for each day.
