Who is your neighbour?





Seafarers and fishers play a vital role in all of our lives, but they often work in difficult, hazardous conditions. The number of crews abandoned by their employers is still at a record high. Conflicts around the world are compromising seafarers' safety, and many are experiencing stress and poorer mental health.

Stella Maris (formerly known as Apostleship of the Sea) is the maritime agency of the Catholic Church. Its teams of chaplains provide practical help and pastoral care to seafarers and fishers in the UK and around the world. Please encourage your parish to stand alongside seafarers and fishers so that they will always have a friend in port who they can turn to. Invite your parish to support Sea Sunday on **Sunday 13th July** (or any other date that suits your parish better) by praying for seafarers and giving online or to the collection at Mass.

Gospel Meditation Luke 10:25-37

So, who is our neighbour? Our neighbour does not just mean someone who lives near us; it also means strangers we meet. And when seafarers arrive in a port, they are strangers in a foreign land. Their home can be thousands of miles away.

They do not know the locals. Often, they do not speak the language. And they do not know how to do many of things that we take for granted where we live. Where can I find a shop to buy toiletries? How do I get there? How can I access the internet to contact my family? Where is the nearest church?

It is the stranger that Stella Maris port chaplains and volunteer ship visitors are there to help when they go on board a ship. Like the Good Samaritan in the Gospel, they are concerned for the welfare of those they meet.

Stella Maris chaplains help foreign seafarers with friendship and to find necessary healthcare, and they support them until they have recovered from injuries or illnesses. Chaplains also help to find dental care, and even mental health resources.

The help Stella Maris chaplains give might include providing a mobile phone top-up, warm clothes in the winter, or arranging for seafarers to attend Mass or Confession or both. At other times, it might mean helping a seafarer resolve an issue with their employers over working conditions or pay.

The Gospel calls us all to help the stranger. Stella Maris chaplains and ship visitors do this every day in ports around the UK and the world.

We pray for all who have died, especially members of our own family and community, and for all those lost at sea.

LORD HEAR US.

May the grace of the Jubilee Year reawaken in us a yearning for the treasures of Heaven. May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. May the hope of the Jubilee inspire us, our parish community, and seafarers and fishers around the world.

Good morning/afternoon/evening everyone

My name is ______ and I am here on behalf of Stella Maris, the official maritime charity of the Catholic Church, which you may also know as the Apostleship of the Sea.

Firstly, I would like to thank you for your generosity each year during Sea Sunday. Your donations reach thousands of seafarers and fishers. Without it, Stella Maris simply couldn't do this vital work.

In today's Gospel we heard about the love and care that the Good Samaritan showed to the stranger that he found upon the road. For seafarers and fishers, Stella Maris is that Good Samaritan. Its chaplains and volunteers in ports all over the world offer friendship and support to seafarers and fishers, in good times and in bad.

I'd like to share a story with you today that shows just how much your kindness means.

Carlo was working as a cook on a ship when he suddenly fell seriously ill. He was due to fly home to the Philippines, but instead was admitted to hospital. The ship had to leave and Carlo faced being left completely alone in a foreign country.

He spent three weeks in hospital. During that time Steve, one of Stella Maris' port chaplains, became a lifeline – visiting him regularly and supporting him as a Good Samaritan. Steve brought clean clothes, food, and a mobile phone SIM card so that Carlo could speak to his family. On his birthday, Steve arrived with a card and a small gift. It was a simple act of kindness, but it meant the world.

Three weeks is a long time to be stuck in a hospital bed, far from home, with no familiar faces. But thanks to Steve, Carlo had someone to visit him. Someone who made sure he was not alone or forgotten. He had a friend.

Even after Carlo returned home, Stella Maris' support didn't stop. Steve still checks in on him from the UK, and a Stella Maris chaplain in the Philippines is making sure he gets the care he needs there.

This is just one story. Over the past year, Stella Maris supported more than 100,000 seafarers in UK ports, and many more worldwide. But the need is growing. More crews are being abandoned. Many seafarers still aren't allowed shore leave. Mental health is worsening.

In this Jubilee Year, we are invited to be 'Pilgrims of Hope', people who bring light into dark places and show mercy in action. That is exactly what your support of Stella Maris does. It brings hope to those who feel forgotten. It reminds them they are not alone.

That's why your support this Sea Sunday matters so much. Your donations allow Stella Maris to be there for people like Carlo when they need it most.

Parish Checklist

Before Sea Sunday

- Confirm with the Parish Priest that there will be a second collection at the end of all Masses on Sea Sunday weekend.
- Ask one of the readers or another volunteer to read the appeal talk during Mass on Sea Sunday, if this is possible. Otherwise perhaps the Priest may be able to read the appeal or play the audio appeal.
- Please display the posters on your notice board as soon as possible
- Put the announcement in the parish newsletter, one for the week before, one for Sea Sunday.
- If possible, include the intercessions for seafarers and the work of Stella Maris in the service.
- Pass on our children's activity sheet to the children's catechists.

On Sea Sunday

- Make Gift Aid envelopes available around pews before people arrive for Mass, or hand them out as people arrive
- Check that the reader, volunteer or Parish Priest has the appeal text to read towards the end of Mass, before the second collection

After Sea Sunday

- Please send the collection by cheque, payable to 'Stella Maris', to Stella Maris, 39 Eccleston Square, London, SW1V 1BX, together with the Gift Aid envelopes, so the tax can be reclaimed.
- Please display the thank you poster (on the reverse of the A4 poster) and fill in the amount your parish raised.
- Put the thank you announcement in your newsletter the week after Sea Sunday.
